Does your pet require ongoing prescription medication? If you answered YES, read on:

Many pets require ongoing medication at one point or another. It's important to understand that as a licensed veterinary practice there are several laws we are required to follow when dispensing prescription medications for animals in our care:

a) Pet's that are using ongoing medications require six monthly rechecks. This law is in place to protect your animals health by preventing over or under-dosing; to ensure they are not having any adverse reactions to the medication and also to monitor for disease changes as they age. Pets do age approximately seven years to our one year, so going to the vet every six months for is like seeing your doctor every 3-4 years for prescriptions. Medication checks are counted as a standard consultation, and can also be performed as part of your annual vaccination!

b) Finally, many medications are not stocked at the clinic on a regular basis. Some need to be compounded or ordered in specifically. If you require a script filled <u>PLEASE CALL THE CLINIC FIRST TO ORDER</u> <u>MEDICATION BEFORE HEADING DOWN</u>. This gives us

Failure to call first may result in extended waiting times for your pets medication and unnecessary stress, which is never helpful.
